INNOVATION Contributing Insights The longitudinal research project initiated in 2019 by NUWAY® and the University of Minnesota Center for Practice Transformation garnered many additional participants throughout the year. This research, designed to determine the effects of recoverysupportive housing on the outcomes of people engaging in addiction treatment, has produced vital information and has the potential to shape national recovery residence policies. The sheer number of NUWAY® clients voluntarily participating in this study more than 5,500 — makes it the largest of its kind, and the findings to date yield a high rate of statistical reliability. This study is generating vital data that can help researchers, treatment providers, insurance companies, and policymakers nationwide.

RECOVERY ACCESS



In 2022, NUWAY Alliance expanded access at outpatient continuing care (ASAM 1.0) to individuals outside the NUWAY Alliance continuum of care and increased the number of residential beds (ASAM 2.1) at Cochran Recovery Services. The expansion addresses the needs of clients experiencing more acute symptoms and needs while staying within NUWAY Alliance's treatment continuum.

2022 INTERNSHIP/PRACTICUM PROGRAM



NUWAY Alliance is one of Minnesota's largest behavioral healthcare practicum providers. Here, expert clinicians supervise students from leading colleges and universities to help emerging social workers, counselors, and psychiatric nurse practitioners successfully complete their training and enter the workforce. The need for skilled behavioral healthcare workers is intense, and NUWAY Alliance is working to ensure high-quality training and a positive environment to help tomorrow's behavioral healthcare leaders gain real-world experience and knowledge to address the demand.

NUWAY®

Begun in 1966 as one of the nation's first halfway houses, NUWAY® (NUWAY) is Minnesota's largest nonprofit provider of extended behavioral healthcare. Providing recovery in supportive environments in the hearts of recovery communities across Minnesota, NUWAY now operates three medium-intensity residential programs (ASAM 3.1) and eight nonresidential (ASAM levels 2.1 & 1.0) programs throughout Minnesota.

Innovation Recognition

UCare recognizes NUWAY® for housing support innovation in mental health and addiction recovery.

UCare's 14th annual "A Salute to Excellence!" event in October recognized 22 clinics and care systems with top results in 2021 Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS) measures including preventive care, disease management, behavioral health, maternity care, care transitions and medication management. NUWAY® received UCare's Innovation Award for implementing innovative strategies to improve the mental health and addiction recovery of UCare members. NUWAY® was recognized for addressing housing insecurity as part of addiction care to help individuals who struggle most gain access to sustainable recovery from addiction.

This year's A Salute to Excellence! was hosted online and in person,

with more than 50 health care clinicians and staff in attendance. The evening opened with remarks from UCare President and CEO Hilary Marden-Resnik, followed by a feature presentation from the Vice President of Primary Care at Park Nicollet about establishing a continuously effective quality program. UCare's Innovation Award was then presented to NUWAY® by UCare Vice President of Mental Health and Substance Use Disorders. and SNBC Programs Jennifer Garber. Next, UCare Senior Vice President and Chief Medical Officer Tenbit Emiru, MD, PhD, MBA, honored guests with UCare Excellence in Health Care Awards for their quality results.

NUWAY®'s mission of Recovery In Supportive Environments, which it has pursued since 1966, helps to connect people seeking recovery with highquality recovery residence operators that adhere to quality standards.



Accreditation and Expanded Footprint

NUWAY® continued demonstrating adherence to the highest healthcare quality standards by completing a review by The Joint Commission, one of the world's largest and most significant accrediting bodies. Joint Commission accreditation signifies to clients, colleagues, and partners that NUWAY® meets or exceeds established quality standards, practices measurement-based care and is among the leading healthcare providers nationwide.

Each NUWAY® counseling center location creates an impact larger than its treatment footprint. Through partnerships with community-based

recovery residences that meet quality standards such as compliance with local ordinances, insurance, and property inspections, NUWAY® stimulates the growth and availability of non-clinical, peer-led independent recovery residence operators who foster and maintain recovery-supportive environments.

Although NUWAY® did not expand into new communities in 2022, it did grow and mature its intensive outpatient programs in Duluth and St. Cloud along with expanded availability at outpatient continuing care at St. Paul NUWAY Counseling Center.

Cochran Recovery Services

Cochran Recovery Services is a medium-intensity residential (ASAM 3.1) program for individuals identifying as men.

Opened in 1974 and acquired by NUWAY Alliance in 2019, this 60-bed facility continued to meet a vital need in 2022 by providing quarantine space for clients with COVID allowing them to continue receiving care and treatment. Additionally, Cochran expanded the number of beds at its facility providing an opportunity for stabilization for clients who are currently in programming throughout NUWAY Alliance and need more support. The ability to adapt programming to better address client needs is a primary benefit of becoming part of the NUWAY Alliance. Cochran served more than 650 individuals in 2022.

The Gables

The Gables, providing medium-intensity (ASAM 3.1) residential treatment to women for nearly 40 years, continues to grow under NUWAY Alliance leadership. Since acquiring The Gables from its founders in 2020, additions to the program's infrastructure, programming, and clinical team have resulted in The Gables reestablishing its prominence as a high-quality treatment program. 2022 included: treating 500+ women, facility upgrades (e.g., interior repainting and the remodeling of clinical office spaces to improve the comfort of clients and clinicians), and Program Manager, Erin Bachman, being appointed to the MARRCH (Minnesota Association of Resources for Recovery and Chemical Health) Board of Governors.

Recovery Residence Partnerships

Ensuring access to high-quality recovery residences is foundational to the NUWAY Recovery Foundation purpose. Through partnerships with independently owned and operated recovery residences in the community, our partnerships are managed by a team of recovery housing experts that work diligently to ensure our partners provide the best recovery residence experience for their residents who are often participating in treatment at NUWAY®. This includes ongoing education, communication and support that helps recovery residences provide a safe, peer-led, non-clinical, recovery-focused environment

that contributes to better engagement and compliance in the treatment process and contributes to building a strong foundation in recovery to carry forward following treatment. In 2022, the NUWAY® Recovery Foundation resumed bringing NUWAY team members on tours of its numerous recovery residence partners. Visiting the residences and establishing relationships with operators creates client-supportive connections that can identify at-risk clients earlier, help clients maintain treatment engagement, and ensure that clients are connected to helpful community resources.
